☐ Head Coach:

The head coach is the leader of the coaching staff and the ultimate decision-maker during the game. They oversee the entire game, including clock management, timeouts, challenges, and player personnel. They also typically have the final say on play calls, although they may delegate those responsibilities to the offensive and defensive coordinators. In essence, the head coach is the captain of the sideline, guiding the team's strategic decisions and ensuring that the game plan is executed effectively.

Credentials Required:

- **Coached with the City of Port Wentworth Parks and Recreation Department for at least 2 seasons.**
- **All COACH NAYS training is completed and up to date.**
- **Attendance for ALL coaches training or clinics.**

☐ Assistant Coach:

An assistant coach's responsibilities revolve around supporting the head coach and contributing to the team's success by assisting with training, strategy, and administrative tasks. They often have specialized roles, like focusing on player development or recruiting, while also providing overall support.

Credentials Required:

- **All COACH NAYS training is completed and up to date.**
- **Attendance for ALL coaches training or clinics.**

☐ Offensive Coordinator:

The offensive coordinator is responsible for developing the offensive game plan and calling offensive plays.

Credentials Required:

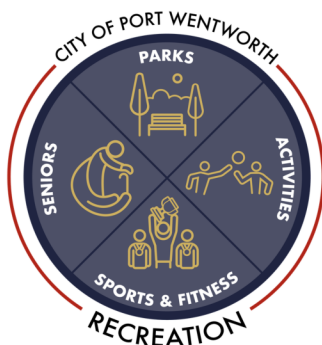

☐ Sideline Manager:

A sideline manager's primary responsibility is to ensure the team is properly equipped and ready for game day, including enforcing rules and regulations. They also assist with various game-day administrative tasks, such as monitoring player attendance and managing equipment.

To include:

- In charge of finding 3 volunteers to help with chain during the game.
- Keeping track of team schedules, managing roster changes, and ensuring proper communication between the team and other relevant parties.
- Ensure that all necessary equipment is readily available and in good condition for game day, including uniforms, cleats, and other protective gear.
- Expected to maintain a positive and supportive attitude towards the team, encouraging players and providing a sense of unity and camaraderie.

Credentials Required:

- **All COACH NAYS training is completed and up to date.**

☐ Team Parent:

The Team Parent's responsibility is to act as a point of contact for the team, communicating with coaches, players, and parents regarding team events, schedules, and other relevant information and may be responsible for managing player attendance, ensuring that all players are present at the required events and meetings.

- In charge of finding volunteers to help in concessions for each home game. Every parent needs to volunteer at least once before the end of the season.
